COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The Planning Department is very busy with various commercial and residential projects. In the southeast quadrant of the Township, construction is progressing on 500 residential units across multiple projects. Stanley Park clean up is under way and the park is now open for pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The Township has applied for a Land and Water Conservation grant for development funds for the park. The award timeline notification for this grant is Fall 2022. In May we received a \$50,000 grant from the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. foundation for the Triangle Trail project mentioned above by the Supervisor.

Property Tax Payments - Payment in the form of cash or check is accepted at the counter of the Treasurer's *Department* in the Township offices. Payment may also be made online at www.whitelaketwp.com. See the "Pay Local Taxes" link on the Treasurer's page of the website or the online payments button on the home page. Fees are charged for online payments.

Bills, Building Permits and Dog Licenses. A convenience fee will be charged for all credit card transactions.

Summer 2021 Property Taxes - Summer taxes are payable through September 14, 2021, without late fees. Please include your phone number on your check or tax remittance slip in case there are questions

Dog Licenses - Dog licenses expire on December 31st each year. A license is required once a dog reaches the age of four months. A current rabies certificate is required. Dog licenses may be purchased online through Oakland County at https://www.oakgov.com/petadoption/pages/dog-license.aspx or at the Township offices Treasurer window.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

We continue to be very busy even during the pandemic. This year we have processed 1,230 permits to date, 55 of which were new home permits.

Permits are required for roofs and windows. Remind your contractors that permits are necessary for these projects. Permits are also required for new homes, additions, renovations, decks, new furnaces, A/C units and other building, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing projects.

Building permits provide the means for our Building Official and Inspectors to protect us by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING INFO

Green For Life (GFL) is the company contracted by the Township to pick up garbage, recycling, yard waste, and bulk items. For garbage questions or concerns, call GFL Customer Service at **1-844-464-3587**.

- -A larger, 65-gallon wheeled recycling cart (with lid) may now be purchased for \$65 by calling **GFL** at **1-844-464-3587**. Also, call GFL directly if your garbage cart or bin needs to be replaced.
- -Bulk items can be placed at the curb on your garbage day for pickup. No call ahead is required. Visit our garbage & recycling web page at www.whitelaketwp.com for accepted items.
- -Please bag all garbage before placing in the cart to ensure all items make it into the truck on windy days and to keep carts clean.
- -Services will be delayed by ONE day if your pick-up day falls on or after the following holidays during the business week: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

-2021 yard waste pick-up runs March 29 thru December 10.

-Recycling Tips: NO plastic bags or Styrofoam containers. Plastics labeled #1-7 only. No greasy pizza boxes. Please rinse containers before placing in recycling bin/cart.

The Supervisor's office has secured a free recycling program in which residents can earn coupons for recycling. Look for a mailer from GFL with details regarding how to use this program.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICES

New Iron Filtration plant is coming beginning fall of 2021!




White Lake Township is partnering with Huron Valley School District on a project to bring Township water to the Lakeland Campus. In addition to over 2 miles of watermain to the Lakeland Campus, the project will add iron filtration to the Aspen Meadows Treatment Plant. This is the second largest wellhouse and the main supply for the north half of the Township water system.

In 2017, the Township finished adding iron filtration to the Village Acres Treatment Plant. Village Acres is the largest wellhouse in the Township system which supplies iron free water to the south section of our water system.

The completion of this new project will give White Lake the ability to supply iron free water to the entire Township water system during normal water use periods. Construction is set to begin in the fall of 2021 and will take approximately one year to complete.

ASSESSING DEPARTMENT

Homeowners who both own and occupy their home as of June 1st are eligible for a Principal Residence Exemption (PRE), which reduces the tax rate of the property. Homeowners can only claim one PRE at a time. (PRE status is listed on your tax bill.) You must file a Request to Rescind PRE when you no longer own and/or occupy the home as your principal residence.

The July Board of Review will meet this year on July 20th, 2021 to correct mutual mistakes of fact or clerical errors on the assessment roll. Poverty appeals and affidavits for disabled veterans, who meet the criteria for an exemption, are also handled at the July Board of Review.
